Exhibitions and upcoming museums

Stockholm is home to many great museums. Sweden introduced free entry at 18 state owned museums last year. The intention is to make culture more accessible for everyone. In Stockholm this means free entrance to the following museums: The Hallwyl Museum, the Maritime Museum, the Army museum, the Museum of Ethnography, the Swedish History Museum, the Mediterranean Museum, Moderna Museet, the National museum, Swedish Museum of Natural history, Skokloster Palace, the Museum of Far Eastern Antiquities and the Royal Coin Cabinet. Haymarket by Scandic

In May 2016 Haymarket by Scandic opened its doors in the historic PUB building. Inspired by the Swedish actress Greta Garbo, the hotel can be described as having a historic exterior, a timeless interior, and a contemporary soul. This is a hotel of contrasts between classic and chic, between sophistication and an urban sensibility.

The chef duo aims to provide a vivid, intimate and easily accessible experience in this bright and carefully considered restaurant.
